30mph extension along Eaton Lane

Not all motorists using Eaton Lane remain within the speed limit, the increasing number of speeding vehicles is a danger to other road users and to residents. The road has numerous concealed entrances and bends which make the road a greater danger.

The current speed limit on Eaton Lane from Cotebrook into the village is 40mph, it would be safer if this was reduced to 30mph. To begin the process of assessing the true speed to vehicles on the road the Parish Council will try to hire temporary speed monitors and liaising with the Highways Department to further the work that has already been undertaken with them.

20mph zone

The Parish Council and Mike Wilson prepared a proposal for the original rectangle of Lower Lane; Winterford Lane; Edgewell Lane; & Eaton Lane (between the two) to be included as a 20mph zone for Highways consideration. Highways Department have confirmed that the proposal will be assessed, with any

improvements occurring in year three of the 20mph project. The equipment that had been placed outside the Jessie to assess traffic failed, this assessment will reoccur, and the results known during April 2018, any works will be carried out during 2018-19 financial year.
