<u>Draft Oil and Gas Exploration, Production and Distribution, Supplementary Planning Document</u> (SPD) Consultation.

- The SPD will provide more detail to the Local Plan.
- Exploration, for gas and oil includes determining how much gas and oil is available and how easy it can be extracted.
- The right to carry out Exploration does not necessarily mean planning permission will be applied for or granted.
- Receiving planning permission is only one part of the process, other agencies are involved including the Health and Safety Executive (HSE), Oil and Gas Authority and the Environment Agency (EA)
- The Onshore Hydraulic Fracturing (Protected Areas) Regs 2016, places protection on Areas
 of Outstanding Natural Beauty, National Parks, The Broads, and World Heritage Site.
 Ground Water Protection Source Area and relevant surface areas within 50m of strata
 used for the supply of water for domestic or food production are also protected under the
 Regs.
- Areas of green belt or SSSI are not protected under these Regs, therefore an application could be submitted for an area of greenbelt. Each planning application requires and Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), showing that the land will be fully restored after

works are complete, with no detrimental impact on surface waters, air quality or noise levels, wildlife will not be impacted upon and transport and accessibility must show no impact on the surrounding roads.

- If applications come into an area, Parish Councils may be able to appoint an independent consultant paid for with the aid of a grant to assist planning application decisions.
- Consultation response to be sent by 18th November. Rushton Parish Council will be making the following comments:
- The Need for an EIA needs to be tightened
- Due to the large volumes of gas that can be extracted daily traffic movements need to be controlled to prevent further congestion on Cheshire's main and village roads. Hours of operation or traffic movements may alleviate some of the pressures on our roads.
- Live monitoring of emissions and noise would be required with the results being published.
- The chemicals being used in the unconventional extraction process (fracking) need to be clearly publicised.

b) Other

Lorry accident, Monday 15th August 2016.

A lorry damaged the sandstone blocks that form the base of the stone cross that stands in the centre of Eaton Village. Police, Highways and the Insurance company were initially informed of the incident. Subsequently, CWaC Planning Dept and Conservation Team have been assisting to determine the level of protection placed on the monument and therefore the process for repair. Archaeology Planning Advisory Service (APAS) have also assisted in giving advice.

The monument is Grade II listed.

Grosvenor Construction have been appointed to carry out the work. The Parish Council will Liaise with local residents once a start date is known.

16.11.06 Highways

Highways are asking for up to three areas that may be considered for survey during 2017. The three priority area highlighted by the Parish Council are:

1- Lower Lane, from junction at Royal Lane up to and including the triangle at Eaton Primary School. Area needs re-surfacing. A white line on the school side of the road from the junction with the Green to the Winterford Lane junction is causing confusion. There are no markings to indicate whether this is for pedestrians to walk along, and whether parking is prohibited across the line. Parking in this area has caused obstructions on the road and prevented traffic flow. The white lines need clarification or removal.

- 2- Beech Lane, from Beech Lane Cottage towards the picnic area, large pothole on bend and all along the road.
- 3- Oxhays Lane- requires re-surfacing.

Development/Planning/Environment

Picnic Area

Martin Boardman has now completed the works on both copse areas. The copse at the top acts as a viewing facility into the picnic area as this has really opened out.

The tree pack has arrived, 105 trees, comprising of Hazel, Blackthorn, Crab Apple, Elder and Dog Rose.

A wild meadow area is to be included, along with orchard and nature trial which will include bird boxes, bat and bug hotels.

The 'hump' at the top of the site needs to be graded out a bit to ensure lawn mowing is easier

There were two options discussed regarding the position of the entrance, either Hill Bottom entrance with a wall and gate or Hill Top entrance, with bird mouth fencing and gate.

Plans and maps were shown of all options along with the locations of benches, orchard, wildflower meadow and notice board.

Quotes to be gathered by December Parish Council Meeting, plan for excavation works to be complete by end of January and tree planting to be done end of January or early February.

Proposal – Is this the type of park the Parish Council would like to develop?

Do we want the entrance to be at the top?

Do we want the guotes for the December meeting?

Unanimous support from all Councillors present.

Road Safety

The 20mph speed limit changes have been advertised to residents in a Speed Assessment Report.

Road Safety Working Group met on Thursday 10th November, the Speed Assessment Report was discussed and agreed that more of the village should be covered by the 20mph zone.

- 1- All areas covered by 30mph to become 20mph
- 2- Lower Lane currently 40mph from Whalley Drive to School, to become 30mph.
- 3- Eaton Lane from Beech Lane and Cotebrook to village, currently 40mph, should be reduced to 30mph.
- 4- Lower Winterford Lane to become 20mph, but should extend to beyond cottages south of Play Zone.

A letter to be sent by 18th November to Community Speed Management, who are compiling all the consultation responses to the 20mph changes.

Action – letter to be sent to Community Speed Management

E-mail received regarding accident outside Eaton Primary School, where a parent was fastening children into the back of her car and another car drove into the door, causing her to be pushed into the wheel arch. The incident details were past to the headmaster who contacted the police and Highways.
